Introduction

This document describes how a process author can use automation packs in order to save or pass their content to other systems.

Prerequisites

Components Used

The information in this document is based on Tidal Enterprise Orchestrator (TEO) 2.1 or later.

The information in this document was created from the devices in a specific lab environment. All of the devices used in this document started with a cleared (default) configuration. If your network is live, make sure that you understand the potential impact of any command.

Conventions

Automation Packs

Automation packs are the component of TEO that allows a content author to group together and save off or transport content from one TEO system to another.

Create an Automation Pack

In order to create an automation pack, complete these steps:

1. Go to the **Administration tab > Automation Packs** in the Master Console.
2. Right-click **New > Automation Pack**, add objects to your automation pack, and click **OK**.

This will create the automation pack in TEO and set the objects to it.

Move Content from One Server to Another

Complete these steps:

1. Right-click on a current automation pack, and select **Export**. Follow the wizard in order to export the .TAP file to your local hard drive.
2. Move this .TAP file to another TEO Server.
3. In the new TEO Server, go to **Administration > Automation Packs**, and right-click **Import**.
4. Select your .TAP file, and follow the import wizard.

Note: You cannot pass runtime users through automation packs. However, you can pass any other objects.
