2 Logging into the TMS

To create log into TMS:

- 1. In the browser window, enter the IP Address of the TMS followed by /tms. Ex. 14.80.97.182/tms
- 2. Enter the credentials for administrator.

3 Getting to the Option Key Page

To get to the **Option Key** page:


- 1. Click Adminstrative Tools (1).
- 2. Click Configuration (2).

The Licenses and Option Keys page:


- Shows the effect of the licenses entered (1).
- Shows the licenses entered into the TMS (2).



3.2 Entering the Release Key

The **Release Key** must be entered into the **TMS Release Key box (1)** before adding option keys.On the **General Settings** page:

- 1. In the TMS Release Key box (1), enter the release key.
- 2. Click Save (2).




3.3 Adding an Option Key:

The release key must be entered before adding option keys.

The General Setting window above shows that a valid release key has been entered

If the serial number (S/N) states Trial, a release key must be added (i.e., The arrow in the following example points to the serial number (S/N), which does not say "Trial." The green check mark indicates that it is alright to proceed).



In the Option Keys section:


- 1. Click Add Option Key (1).
- 2. In the Add Option Key box (2), enter an option key.
- 3. Click Save (3).




4 Removing TMS Licenses

To remove TMS licenses:

- 1. Open SQL Server Management Studio (1) (if you don't have, you need to download).
- 2. Expand Databases (2).
- 3. Expand the tmsng database (3).
- 4. Expand Tables (4).






- 5. Find dbo.OptionKeys (5).
- 6. Right click on dbo.OptionKeys (6) and select Edit top 200 rows.
- dbo.objSystemTemplateItem
- dbo.objSystemTemplateItemTemplate
- dbo.objSystemTxasSohoPendingData
- dbo.objSystemTxasSohoSystemData
- dbo.objSystemType
- dbo.OptionKeys

 dbo.Pala (a) tTemplate
- dbo.ParticipantTemplateDialOptions

- 7. Highlight the row with the option key you want to delete.
- 8. Right click and select Delete (8).



Within a few minutes after this is done, you can look in TMS to see that it is removed or updated.
