Complete the following steps to create the Codian license entry.

3 Entering Licenses for the IPVCR

To enter a license for the IPVCR:

- 1. Enter the IP of the IPVCR into a browser window.
- 2. Log in as Administrator.

3.1 Getting to the License entry screen

To get to the license entry screen and upgrade the settings:

- 1. Click on **Settings**.
- 2. Click on Upgrade.
