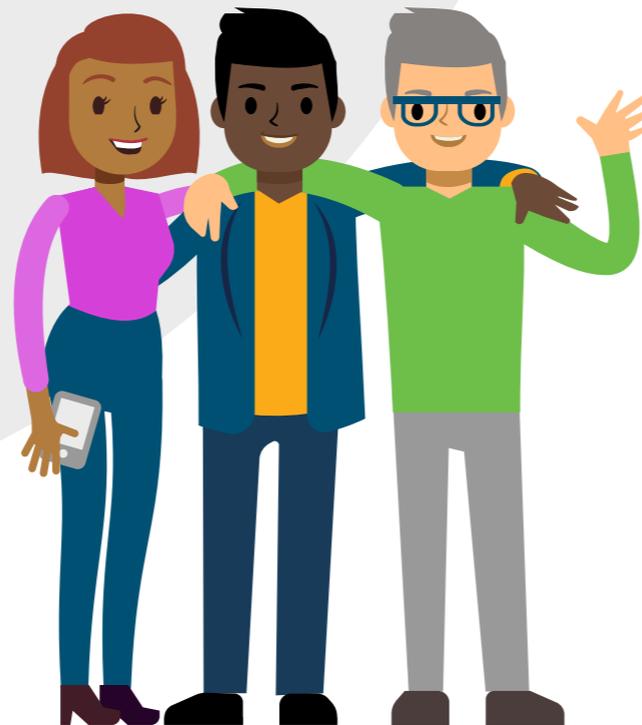


Hey engineering! Share collective intelligence

Pick key topics

Create a space for each key subject matter and give each one a purposeful, descriptive name.

Write a short purpose statement describing who and what this space is for. Select some of the spaces for including external subject matter experts.

Connect the experts

Add subject matter experts into the spaces. It's easy to add them by typing their name or email address. Encourage people to invite their co-workers to contribute too. Anyone can send an invite. This way, when you need help on a key subject, all the experts will be in one place.
