Tidal Enterprise Orchestrator Adapters

Adapters are the components that allow TEO to communicate and interact with multiple components across the IT infrastructure.

Understanding Adapters

Adapters provide a basis for interaction with many components such as SAP, DB2, SNMP, Unix/Linux, VMWare, and many more. Some adapters (for example, SAP Java) require additional components to be installed in order to work properly. An end user will see a Red Shield if the adapter does not have requirements met. The adapter and its activities will not work if this is not configured properly. The shield will be green if all prerequisites are met. Yellow shields mean some things are met, some are not. Inside

adapter configurations an end user can also find overall configurations for the adapter (if applicable) and can find all the activities that are linked back to the adapter by looking at the provides tab. Adapters do not go up or down, they are just available to provide access to the different IT components.
